PACT ACT Healthcare Expansion

Legionnaires. I have a few announcements to make in the following areas in hope of aiding eligible claimants in their quest to receive all the benefits and services based upon eligibility. Areas of interest include but not limited to: Compensation, Healthcare, and Burial Benefits. I will begin with healthcare because of the huge implications it offers

Firstly, as of March 5, 2024, eligibility to healthcare has expanded to include the following: Individuals with service in the Vietnam War, Gulf War, Iraq, Afghanistan, or any other combat zone after 9/11, or you deployed in support of the Global War on Terrorism, or you were exposed to toxins or other hazard during military service at home or abroad. You do not have to have a service connected disability to be eligible. Please contact your nearest Veterans Affairs Hospital and apply.

Secondly, during our Washington Conference Visit, we were urged to spread the news about the availability of pre-registering for interment at your local veterans cemetery. I know this is not a popular subject, but registering you and your spouse will save lots of time and effort during a time that can be difficult for some.

Lastly, ensure that you seek advice from an accredited Service Officer when you are ready to file your claim. It is advisable to have a copy of your latest rating decision available to ensure your claim is filed on the proper form. Greetings, Legionnaires. Allow me to update you on what is happening in The America Legion. First of all, Two teams (A & B) went to Washington D.C. to attend meetings and to meet with our legislators February 24-28. Team members on our team(B) besides me, were Lorenzo Rogers, Michael Westergren, Dallas Erdman, Auxiliary members, Carol

Westergren, Janice Rogers Although the Congressmen were not in Washington at the time, we did have the opportunity to discuss The American Legion's legislative agenda with the Congressmen's staff and we did meet with Senator John Bozeman since he was in Washington at that time. We asked for support for several bills that would help our veterans and/or military and their families but we, as Legionnaires need to do our part. Our National Commander is asking us all to contact our legislators to help get The American Legion's priority bills passed. It's really simple, just go to: www.votervoice.net/AmericanLegion/register

Once you register, you will automatically receive a notice with a preprinted letter to your representatives whenever there is a bill that National wants the legislators to vote for. You only have to click on it and you're done. We are very fortunate to have legislators in our state that are very supportive of our military and veterans so let them hear from you. There are several bills that need support but I'm just asking you to follow up on just two important bills since they have a connection to the Legion's Be the One campaign to help curb suicide.

Caregiver Outreach and Program Enhancement (COPE) Act (H.R. 3581) Summary: to expand, improve, and coordinate mental health resources for caregivers.

2) Daniel J. Harvey Jr. and Adam Lambert Improving Servicemember Transition to Reduce Veteran Suicide Act (S123)

This bill requires the Department of Defense and Department of Veterans Affairs to jointly carry out a five-year pilot program to assess the feasibility and advisability of providing certain services and a module comprised of specified elements as part of the pre-separation transition process for members of the Armed Forces for the purpose of reducing suicide among veterans. Specifically, the bill authorizes the VA to award grants to implement, coordinate, improve, and enhance mental health counseling, treatment, and support for all family caregivers of veterans participating in this vital program.

Please "Be The One" to help get these bills passed! I look forward to seeing each of you at the Department Convention in June.



MOVING FROM THE STONE AGE TO THE ELECTONIC AGE

As many of you are aware the Department has always paid our bills by checks. It is a safe and somewhat efficient way of meeting obligations. But it is a costly method in man-hours and postage fees. There is in this electronic age a faster, more efficient, and cost-effective means to meet our obligations. The means is with electronic banking. Many of the posts on a monthly basis get an email or letter that they have membership funds available at Department. They then request said funds to be sent to them by check. This process is time consuming and expensive. We at the Department are in the process of taking as many actions as possible to make our processes more efficient and economical. Therefore, in your near future we will be requesting that each post provide us with routing and account numbers of their banking account so that we can electronically send you the funds. This simple action will save us many man-hours and mailing costs. It will also mean the transfer of your funds quickly to your account. Imagine not having to go to the bank to deposit a check.

In addition, those individuals asking for reimbursement for travel or other expenses will be requested to provide the banking information so that their reimbursement can be sent quickly to them and at a cost savings for the Department.

We are acutely aware that if a criminal has both your routing number and account number, they can potentially steal money from your account through fraudulent ACH transfers and payments. You should treat your routing and account information like the means you use to protect your SSAN. All post and member information will be secure by strong passwords on our servers and routers.
